Program Overview

The Augustana College pre-physical therapy program is not a graduation major, so a major in some other field must be completed if the student intends to graduate with a Bachelor of Arts degree. The choice of graduation major is not critical for acceptance into a PT graduate program, but because of the high number of required courses, majors in biology, kinesiology, and/or psychology are the most common.

Augustana College has a “guaranteed admission” agreement with [Washington University](#) (St. Louis), as well as a 3+2.5 “coordinated degree” program with [St. Ambrose University](#). Students interested in either the guaranteed admission agreement with Washington University or the 3+2.5 coordinated degree program with St. Ambrose University should contact Dr. Mettler early in their first year for more information.
